But the challenge we face is so much larger. At least 350 million individuals with disabilities live in areas where support services are not available. 80% of them are unemployed, and 30 million of them are children not in school.

To leverage your support and our programs to reach even more of those in need, we are creating the new EquallyAble Center for Advancement, Rehabilitative Empowerment and Support (CARES). This visionary concept will for the first time bring together under one roof the services and support necessary for those with disabilities to become independent, productive participants in their communities.

Center for Advancement, Rehabilitative Empowerment and Support

CARES is a five-year, \$5 million project which will be completed in three phases:

- **Phase I:** Establish the Center, providing orthotics/prosthetics, hearing and vision aids, therapies.
- **Phase II:** Expand the Center to provide small business vocational and technical training.
- **Phase III:** Add motivational coaching and mentoring to individuals and families with disabilities.
